Why a Leadership Training?

The triple planetary crisis calls for unprecedented solutions that are systemic, emergent, participatory and supportive of a social and ecological transformation. And this, in turn, requires great leadership, namely wise and effective engagement for a healthy planet and people.

Companies with improved gender diversity are more likely to engage in sustainable practices. An underrepresentation of women could therefore slow down the transition to a circular economy. However, women still face additional challenges when they take on leadership positions or aspire to do so. At the same time, the circular economy offers opportunities for female social and economic empowerment. Tapping the potential of female leaders and multipliers can therefore deliver both social and environmental benefits.

Objective of the Training

With the PREVENT Waste Alliance Leadership Training, circular economy change agents engage in cutting-edge leadership learning. The training supports you

- to develop individual and collective leadership skills
- to connect with fellow female leaders and build a strong network
- to strengthen your voice as female change agent
- to implement change
- to make a difference for the circular economy
- to act as a multiplier for effective leadership within your teams, institutions, networks, systems and spheres of influence

In addition, we will work on cases from the reuse sector and visit a reuse company to dive deeper into the topic.

Training Outline

The training course will focus on four dimensions of transitional change: Team, Organisation, Society and Self. You will experience hands-on learning with a focus on "simple habits for complex times", easy-to-use practices and tools for everyday formal and informal leadership work.

With this course you will learn to

- Re-direct your attention to see the larger system: Understanding systemic connections, embracing uncertainty, and providing orientation.
- Take care of yourself: Practicing mindful leadership, applying self-reflection, focusing attention, and using personal resources wisely and efficiently, also in challenging environments for female leaders in the circular economy.
- Encourage reflection and fresh thinking: Supporting courageous acting and learning, being highly culturally conscious and gender-sensitive, and facilitating a new culture of co-creation based on participation and dialogue.

In addition, you will have ample time for peer-to-peer learning and networking with fellow participants from the circular economy community. You will also learn more about the Circular City Labs project, upcoming activities in your country, and how you can further engage.

Participant Profile

We invite applications from participants with the following profile:

- Female professionals from the public and private sector involved in circular economy, reuse systems or packaging value chains, who are very likely to integrate reuse into their work/business
- Must be based in one of the project partner countries of Circular City Labs: Albania, Kosovo, Georgia, Colombia or South Africa. Priority will be given to applicants located in the following cities: Tirana, Tbilisi, Pristina, Bogotá, Capetown, uMhalthuze or Ekurhuleni.
- Experiences in or with leadership in practice (taking responsibility, leading people, engaging for a topic or alike)
- Curiosity to experience experiential educational concepts, high level of self-reflection and inter-personal competencies
- English language proficiency

The Circular City Labs project will cover the costs of the training, accommodation, and meals during the workshop days.

By applying for this programme, you confirm that you will cover the travel costs yourself (costs for flights, trains, etc.). Exceptions can only be made for strong applications and based on a good justification why the costs cannot be covered.

Please note that the training starts on 22nd January in the morning and ends on 26th January in the afternoon. By applying you confirm that you can take this time for the Leadership Training. Please let us know if you cannot arrange to come to Germany but are still interested in engaging in the Circular City Labs in your country.
