# Leadership challenges in the circular economy



## Managing change

Circular economy change agents face lots of resistance. They need to be able to deal with conflicts and successfully manage change within their circle of influence.



## Harnessing the power of peers

Many circular economy leaders act in isolation and do not harness the power of their global peers.



## Collaborating along global value chains

Circularity only works through collaboration: Leaders must be able to forge meaningful partnerships with other actors along global value chains.



## Managing personal resources

Impact-driven leaders are prone to activist burnout and need to manage their personal resources wisely and effectively.

**Empowering circular economy change agents** in leading themselves, their teams and organisations better, thus contributing to more circularity and creating meaningful change for society.



Creating an **international peer group of CE leaders from the Global South and North** who support each other in the long term – through peer consultation, business collaboration etc.

# Our solution

- An intense 5 days leadership programme (in person) to empower systemic change agents worldwide
- A diverse and carefully selected group of 16 circular economy changemakers from all around the globe
- A needs-based training programme with a focus on four aspects of leadership:
  - Leading Self
  - Leading Teams
  - Leading Organisations
  - Leading Social Change

# What makes this training unique



Participants work with a **peer group of hand-picked circular economy changemakers** from around the globe



Leadership skills are taught based on **concrete circular economy cases** brought in by the participants



**Needs-based training approach:** every participant gets an onboarding call with one of the trainers and the needs of the group are addressed in the training programme

# The training focuses on leadership skills – so how does the circular economy aspect come into play?

- Through the **participants** and their diverse backgrounds in the circular economy
- Through **cases** that the participants bring to the training and that are discussed in exercises such as the Peer Case Consultation or the Circle of Influence
- Through a **field trip**: part of the training is a visit to a company from the circular economy sector (e.g., a provider of reuse systems or a waste management company)
- Through a **networking evening** with other circular economy experts

# Module 1: Leading Self

## Exemplary learning goals

- Reflection on what is leadership; Different archetypes of leadership
- Looking inwards: Core personal values; identity molecule and authenticity
- Challenges and stresses in leading self, listening to the body
- Exercise: How does it feel to lead and follow?



# Module 2: Leading Teams

## Exemplary learning goals

- Turning the look outwards: Becoming aware of how others view situations, awareness and perception
- Reflection on what is a team and phases of team development
- Giving and receiving feedback, active listening
- Methods for peer consultation



# Module 3: Leading in Organisations

## Exemplary learning goals

- Elements of an organisation; models to look at organisations
- Aspects of organisational culture and role of the leader
- Field trip: visit to a circular economy company to observe organisational culture



# Module 4: Leading Social Change

## Exemplary learning goals

- Circle of influence: What can I control?
- Cooperation in networks
- Change management process / change formula
